

Doyle Street Pool / Camp Fire Georgia

Swim A Poolza

Arrival and Departure:

Drop off each day is between 8:30-8:45 am at The Doyle Street Pool. Late drop offs will not be accepted, a refund or discount will not be given if your participant is late and not accepted. Parents/guardians will not be able to access the pool building. Please send your participant dressed and ready to swim, with sunblock already applied. Each child will have their temperature taken at drop off and will not be admitted if their temperature is over 100.4 degrees.

Pick up each day is between 11:45 am - 12:00 pm at The Doyle Street Pool.

Early pickups are not allowed. Please wait outdoors until we are ready to release each child. Parents/guardians will not be able to access the pool building. The parent/guardian picking up must show a photo ID **EACH DAY** to sign out their participant.

Cancellations / Refunds: Splash Bash may be cancelled for rain or cold weather. Registered participants will be contacted as early as possible if the event is cancelled. Refunds will only be given if the event is cancelled by Camp Fire Georgia.

What to bring: Please send your child dressed and ready to swim, with sunblock already applied. A towel and flip flops are recommended. Please no large pool toys/inflatables. All life jackets must be US Coast Guard Approved. The pool will be selling concessions, you may choose to send cash with your child. We do not recommend sending electronics such as cell phones; if your child has a phone and/or other electronics they will be asked to keep them in their bag. Camp Fire Georgia / The Doyle Street Pool is not responsible for any lost/ stolen money or items. Additionally, we can not hold lost and found items. Please make sure your participant has all their belongings before departing.

Health and Wellness: DO not send your child if they are not feeling well, have been sick, or have been around someone who has been diagnosed with COVID19. Health and Wellness are at top priority at Camp Fire Georgia and the Doyle Street Pool. Our lifeguards have been trained on how to deal with minor injury and illness. In the event that your child experiences a more severe injury or illness, the Stephens County Hospital is a very short drive away. You will be notified if your child is in need of medical attention. In the event of sickness, fever, injury that will require medical attention, etc. the parent will be notified to pick the participant up early from the event. Everyone is asked to wash their hands frequently with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Hand sanitizer will also be available throughout the building. Please talk to your child about the importance of hand washing, social distancing and not sharing items with other children.

Behavior Guidelines: At Camp Fire Georgia / The Doyle Street Pool we strive to provide a positive atmosphere where children develop good social skills and grow as individuals within a group setting. Inappropriate behavior from a few children can affect the experience for the entire group. Children will be informed of our expectations and the consequences of inappropriate behavior. The staff will do their best to manage problems as they arise. Depending on the severity of the offense, parents may be contacted immediately. Our program cannot accommodate participants who display chronic or severely disruptive behavior. Such behavior may be grounds for dismissal from the program. Chronically disruptive behavior is defined as verbal or physical activity, which may include, but is not limited to: Behavior that requires constant attention from the staff. Behavior that inflicts physical or emotional harm on children or staff (i.e. verbally or physically threatening behavior, fighting, etc.). Behavior that is destructive in nature. Behavior that continually ignores or disobeys. We have a zero-tolerance policy for certain items/situations. Participants, parents and staff will be dismissed from our programs for the following offenses: Bringing drugs, alcohol, or weapons of any kind to our programs. Acting in a physically or sexually abusive or harassing manner towards any other person, parent, staff or participant.

Social Network and Blog Policies Participants along with parents/ guardians must be respectful in all communications and blogs related to or referencing Camp Fire Georgia / Doyle Street Pool, its employees, and other participants. Participants must not use blogs or personal web sites to disparage the Camp Fire Georgia and/or other participants or employees of Camp Fire Georgia. Participants must not use blogs or personal web sites to harass, bully, or intimidate other participants or employees of Camp Fire Georgia. Behaviors that constitute harassment and bullying include, but are not limited to, comments that are derogatory with respect to race, religion, gender, sexual orientation, color, or disability; sexually suggestive, humiliating, or demeaning comments; and threats to stalk, haze or physically injure another person.
